Campbellsville Independent Schools will begin the 2020-2021 school year Wednesday, Aug. 26.

In an effort to ensure all students are safe and thrive in their studies, two learning options are available this school year, traditional and virtual.

The information in this document is subject to change, as we work closely with Lake Cumberland District Health Department, Kentucky Department of Education and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention officials.

The safety and health guidelines contained in this document were prepared with guidance from the above agencies, and will continue to be reviewed for the safety and health of all who attend and visit CIS.

The American Academy of Pediatrics strongly advocates all policy considerations for the coming school year start with a goal of having students physically present in school.

Please read the following information as you make the best decision for your child.

CIS officials ask that parents decide which learning option is best for their children by Monday Aug. 10, and contact their school.

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TRADITIONAL SCHOOL

Students enrolled at Campbellsville Independent Schools will return to campus and their classrooms on a regular schedule, with in-person teachers.

Health and safety procedures will be enhanced and routinely examined to meet Kentucky's Healthy at School Guidelines.

CIS staff members believe the best place for our students is in the school building.

Please review the measures on the following page that staff members are taking to ensure students are safe at school.



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ADDITIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY ACTIONS

- Students in first through 12th grades will wear a mask when not socially distant from others.
- Masks will be provided to those who don't have them.
- Students, staff members and visitors will have temperatures checked before entering school, including students who drive, are transported to and/or walk to school.
- Students with COVID-19 symptoms or a fever of 100.5 or higher will be isolated with adult supervision and parents will be contacted before released.
- Students will comply with social distancing requirements, with signs and floors marked for safety.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be placed throughout the schools.
- Cleaning protocols will be increased in all areas.
- Handwashing frequency will be increased.
- Group gatherings will be limited.
- Visitors will be screened and have temperatures checked when attempting to enter school.

TRANSPORTATION HEALTH AND SAFETY ACTIONS

- Students in first through 12th grades will be required to wear a mask while on the bus.
- Masks will be provided to those who don't have them.
- A doctor's note must be provided to the building principal if a mask compromises the health and safety of a student.
- Temperatures will be taken before entering the buses.
- Students will be given hand sanitizer when boarding the bus.
- Students will have assigned seats, with those from the same household sitting together.
- Buses will be sanitized between routes.

FEEDING HEALTH AND SAFETY ACTIONS

- Students will eat lunch in small groups and sit socially distant from others.
- Breakfasts will be served in the classroom, with students socially distant from their classmates.
- Drinking fountains will be closed.
- CES students will receive water in their classrooms, CMS and CHS students will be given water bottles.
- Cafeteria sanitation protocols will be increased, including more frequent sanitization.



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VIRTUAL SCHOOL

Students enrolled in Campbellville Independent Schools virtual learning programs will complete their work outside CIS campuses.

CES

- Students will use Google Classroom for their instruction.
- Students must log in and complete work daily.
- Teachers will respond to student and parent questions within a 24-hour period.

CMS/CHS

- Students will use Edgenuity for their instruction.
- Students must complete work in each content area daily.
- Students will have access to content-specific teachers throughout the school day.



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VIRTUAL SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

- Students must have high quality internet access. For example, the ability to stream a movie.
- If internet access is an issue, parents can contact their child's principal.
- Students must have a reliable electronic device, such as a laptop or desktop computer.
- If necessary, electronic devices will be available for student use, with contracts signed by students and parents.
- Cell phones will not allow students to complete the level of work required.
- Daily attendance and participation will be required.
- Consistent communication will be required between the student and his/her teacher and parents.
- Virtual students can participate in after-school activities and sports, if they meet eligibility requirements.
- Students can request to transfer from traditional classes to the virtual program, or from virtual to traditional, once per nine-week grading period. Students/parents must meet with the building principal before this request will be granted.

DISTRICT SUPPORT

- The partnership between the student, teachers and parents is key to student success.
- Teachers will be available to meet student needs during designated hours. For specifics, please contact building principals.
- Parent training will be available on tools students use to complete their work.
- Students who chose the virtual program will have access to breakfast and lunch.
